As we head towards the end of another busy academic year, I wanted to share with you some of our children's achievements and announcements and say thank you again for your continued support.

All national assessments have now been completed by our pupils and annual reports have been sent out; we are incredibly proud of the resilience and effort our children have shown this year - thank you for supporting them too!

Our sports days went to plan on the desired days and we have been thrilled to hear all the positive comments and thanks that have been passed onto the staff - thank you to each and every one of you who attended to cheer on your child and their team. We are proud that each year we manage a balance of an inclusive sports day, where all children participate whilst maintaining the competitive element of a winner in each 'finals' race. We are aware that sports is an area many children can excel in and we will continue to celebrate this too.

School Visits / Visitors Consultation - June 2023

Thank you to every family who responded to the consultation we shared last month. In total, we received 100 replies from families sharing their thoughts and opinions about our present offer.

I have summarised the responses below:

- 95% of respondents stated that our current offer is suitable and accessible
- 75% of respondents advised that they would feel that up to £30 per year would be appropriate for additional activities
- 58% of respondents advised that they would like the option of making voluntary contributions towards the costs of all visits / visitors during the year, rather than shortly prior to the visit

Some parents kindly provided comments on the questionnaires too. I have selected the popular themes and have been able to reply as below:

You said...	Our response ...
<p>F2 didn't get to go to the library even though they were told it would be re-arranged - the children still talk about this.</p>	<p>The Warmsworth Library is run by volunteers and unfortunately those who support our visits, or family members, have been affected by ill-health. We have tried to rearrange several times and are still in contact with them for future visits. We prioritise reading as a school and wish our children to have good access to libraries. If anyone would like to volunteer to help run the library, I am sure they would love to hear from you.</p>
<p>I believe ALL parents should have to make a payment towards visits/visitors so maybe the cost could be a little lower. I personally feel because it's voluntary there will be the same parents who pay v's not pay.</p>	<p>As a school, we are only able to ask for voluntary contributions for school visits that support the curriculum, we cannot make a charge.</p> <p>The costs for a school visit / visitor is calculated on the cost of providing that visit for your child - there is nothing added to subsidise other children.</p> <p>We are very grateful for everyone who makes a contribution as this means the visits can still go ahead to enrich the experience of our children.</p>
<p>Visits and visitors are important to the children's learning. I am happy to contribute however sometimes a bit more notice for payment would be appreciated as budgets are tighter than ever and if I haven't budgeted for extra school things that month it makes it tricky</p>	<p>We appreciate how difficult managing our finances are at the moment. Next year we will provide as much notice as possible for all school visits on ParentPay, to support families with this. This will mean that you are able to plan your finances and make these voluntary contributions at any time prior to the experience taking place.</p>
<p>I contribute every time, I would like more notice and I'm happy to contribute more if needed I think this visits and guests are important to our children and I'm happy to contribute more for those that can't.</p>	<p>We really appreciate that several parents have commented that they are willing to support the school and increase their voluntary contribution. There is the option to make a voluntary contribution greater than is requested on Parent Pay at any time. To do this, instead of typing in the amount of the voluntary contribution, please type in what you are willing to pay.</p>
<p>I do hope the extra and super curricular activities continue, as they are important in building experiences and knowledge for our children.</p>	<p>We do too!</p> <p>We are planning to maintain the high standard of experiences that we offer our children across school, as we place a great value and importance on these. We will continue to be mindful of the costs involved and we will endeavour to inform of you of any requests for voluntary donations towards visits as soon as we are aware of them, to enable you to plan your spending more easily.</p>

As the end of the year arrives, could you please ensure that all school reading books are returned before the end of term - thank you!

Looking ahead to September 2023

We are all looking forward to starting the next academic year, and we are all busy planning ahead, I am sure some of you will be too.

Uniform:

I know many of you will be thinking ahead to buying or replacing any uniform for the new academic year - you may even have benefitted from our uniform swap-shop this week too! We believe that the wearing of a school uniform helps to give a sense of pride and belonging and we are very proud of how smart all of our children look in their required uniform all year round.

- Black or grey trousers, short or long, but not sportswear
- Black or grey dress/skirt, red or pink gingham dress
- Plain maroon or burgundy sweatshirt or cardigan
- Plain white shirt or polo-shirt
- Black shoes or trainers

P.E. Uniform:

It is important for health and safety that children wear the appropriate clothing for physical education. Earrings are to be removed.

- Black gym shorts
- Plain white t-shirt
- During colder weather, children should wear plain black jogging trousers or black leggings and appropriate footwear - e.g. trainers

Opening time:

Please could I remind everyone that the classroom doors do not open until 8.45am for FS1 (Nursery) and 8.50am for the rest of school. The school gates do not open until 8.40am, so please could we ask that children and parents do not start arriving until 8.40 am at the earliest, once the gates have been opened. We are unfortunately located on a very busy road and do not want any pavements being blocked by people waiting, resulting in anyone having to walk on the road - the safety of all is paramount to us.

Registration opens at 8.50am and closes at 9am, so as long as children arrive between these times, they will be ready and settled for the school day.

School Improvements:

On the return to school you will see the results of work that is planned for over the summer holidays. Some of our carpets have suffered severely from wear this year and we are replacing the carpets in the classrooms, library and music room.

Attendance / Holidays in term-time

Our current school attendance is 94.3%. We are disappointed that this remains well below our target of 97% and we are very concerned about the attendance of some individual children.

This target is being negatively affected by the number of term-time holidays being taken. As a school, we appreciate the cost differences between holidays taken in term-time compared to those in the peak holiday seasons, but we would like to encourage everyone to consider the impact of any lost learning on both the academic and social and emotional needs of the children. No child likes walking into a classroom late or sitting in a lesson when they have missed the previous learning and experiences, and this can have a significantly negative impact on any child.

As we have a duty of care to our children, any absences from school are followed up in the best interests of safeguarding the children. This is why we ask for parents to contact us every day in the case of a child's absence. Much time is spent ensuring our children are safe, when we have not received a reason for a child's absence, this sometimes results in visits to the home address to be advised by neighbours or other children (or secondary schools) that the child has been taken on a family holiday by the parents / carers. Please assist us by informing us each day if your child is absent through illness and complete a leave of absence form (available from the school office or school website) for any other absence.

To assist with the planning of any potential holidays, I have attached our school calendar for 2023-2024 with training days and school holidays clearly marked. As a Local Authority maintained school, any holidays in term-time will be unauthorised, unless they meet the strict Department of Education criteria and there are very few exceptions. As a school, we then refer your case to the Local Authority for handling, as they are responsible for all correspondence, issuing fines etc and we have no further control of the process beyond that point.

One of our teaching assistants will also be moving on to pastures new in September - Mrs Olley will be returning to pursue a career in teaching. I am sure you will all join me in saying a huge thank you to everyone and wish them well in their future adventures!

Our current year 6 children are also leaving us this week to start the next chapter in their journey; good luck to you all - we can't wait to hear about the young adults you become!
