Portable Defibrillator

We are very fotunate and grateful that one of our parents, with a child in Foundation Two, has kindly donated a portable defibrillator for our school. We are in the process of liaising with St John's Ambulance to ensure we are fully trained to be able to use this defibrilator should the need ever arise.

Safeguarding audit

We have recently invited the lead for Doncaster Safeguarding to visit our school and conduct a review of our policies and procedures, and they were very impressed by our children, staff and our school. Should you have any queries or concerns about safeguarding, please contact Mrs Train as our Designated Safeguard Lead (DSL) or our Deputy Designated Safeguard Leads (DDSLs) Miss Nithsdale, Mrs Sharp or Mrs Berry (if Mrs Train is not available).

<u>Natasha's Law</u>

In order to continue keeping our children safe, we are implementing guidance in line with Natasha's Law which came into force on 1st October 2021. Natasha's Law requires all food to be labelled correctly so that no children are put at risk due to food allergies or intolerances. As a consequence, we will not be distributing food that is brought in by children for birthdays etc. This agreement was already in place as part of our Healthy Learning, Healthy Lives accreditation, but we feel that this new law further strenghtens the reasoning behind this policy. However, parents may choose to hand out any birthday celebration treats from their children to other parents at the end of the school day, if they so wish - this then allows the parents of the children to make an informed choice.

Any ingredients of any food products that we sell for enterprise events in the future will be clearly labelled to ensure children and parents are fully aware of the ingredients contained.

Household Support Fund

The Government has made <u>Household Support Funding</u> available to local authorities so that Doncaster Council can support households who would otherwise struggle to buy food or pay essential utility bills.

Funding is available to pay for food for each child in the household who is <u>not eligible for</u> <u>benefits-related Free School Meals</u> where the parent/guardian is receiving any of the following; Council Tax Reduction, Housing Benefit or Universal Credit that includes housing costs in the calculation.

Funding is also available in the form of a **payment of £100 to be used towards the winter fuel bill for**;

- a) parents/guardians with a child/children in the household <u>eligible for benefits-related</u> <u>Free School Meals.</u>
- b) parents/guardians with a child/children in the household <u>not eligible for benefits-</u> <u>related Free School meals</u>, where the parent/guardian is receiving any of the following; Council Tax Reduction, Housing Benefit or Universal Credit that includes housing costs in the calculation
- c) single people and couples with no children who are receiving Council Tax Reduction, Housing Benefit or Universal Credit that includes housing costs in the calculation

<u>Covid 19</u>

If you child starts to exhibit symptoms this weekend, Saturday 18th and Sunday 19th December 2021, or has a positive PCR result, please email us on the secretary email address: <u>secretary@warmsworthschool.co.uk</u> informing us of your child's name, class, and any details regarding dates of symptoms starting, date of PCR taken and result date etc. We are not replacing the government's Track and Trace, but feel it is important to let parents know of any cases which may affect their child.

Thank you for continuing to support us in wearing a mask, or displaying an exemption lanyard etc when on the school premises - this has made many parents and staff feel safer and more comfortable at busy times.

Dinner Money

Most parents are keeping their child's dinner money account in credit; this helps school a great deal - thank you. If you receive a text or phone call from us to advise you that your child's dinner money account has gone into debt, we would appreciate it if you could pay as quickly as possible.
