This is the first time any of our children have been crowned overall Yorkshire winners and we are very proud of every child that took part. Miss Corrigan, as our Design and Technology leader, is exceptionally proud and already planning our participation in next year's project.

Warmsworth Choir Performs!

Our school choir had the amazing opportunity to take part in a collaborative performance with others schools from Doncaster involving singing, dance and sign language at the Doncaster Dome on 23rd June 2022. Their performance was flawless due to the practice in after-school choir sessions and at home, and both staff and parents are incredibly proud of what they all achieved. Dinner Money

Please be aware that cost of a School Meal will rise from £2.59 currently to £2.65 from the 1^{st} September 2022. This is due to an increase in food costs for the catering company.

If you have any outstanding dinner debt, please pay via Parent Pay before the end of term.

Free School Meals - apply now and collect food vouchers.

If your child currently receives means-tested Free school Meals, you are invited to come and collect your £75 ASDA food voucher per eligible child, from the main school office on Monday to Wednesday next week.

Everyone on the School Spider App will have received a message last week regarding applying for meanstested Free School meals. There are criteria for eligibility on the Doncaster Council Website: https://www.doncaster.gov.uk/services/schools/free-school-meals.

Even if your child is currently in FS2, year 1 and year 2, and is eligible for Universal Free School meals under the government scheme, you may also be eligible to apply for Free School Meals. This would then mean that you could receive vouchers in the school holidays if your application is completed before the end of this term and if this continues next academic year.
